From the Director:

October of 2015 marked 20 years since the grand opening of the current library building. Since then, the library has been an involved and integral part of the Baldwinsville Community, partnering with Baldwinsville Center for the Arts. Baldwinsville Central School District, Baldwinsville Chamber of Commerce, Baldwinsville Rotary, and the Museum at Shacksboro Schoolhouse. We are also proud to participate in Seneca River Day, Peony Fest, Farmers' Market and the Village Tree Lighting.

2015 saw the launch of the Silver Fox Audio Book Club. Librarian Nancy Howe meets each Friday with a group of seniors while they listen to and discuss an audiobook. When the book is completed, they gather at the library to watch the movie. The book club was the basis for a session that Nancy presented at a national conference. As a result, the program is featured on the American Library Association website and is being used as a prototype for other libraries.

The library's local history collection includes hundreds of historical photographs which have been digitized. Librarian Diane Holbert worked with Bonnie Kisselstein, the Local History Librarian; Sue McManus, the Shacksboro Museum Director and the Central NY Library Resources Council to add our pictures to the NY Heritage website. New York Heritage (http://www.newyorkheritage.org/) is a valuable resource for anyone who is interested in learning more about the people, places and institutions of New York State.

We now circulate rhythm instrument kits which contain several instruments, such as a xylophone, tambourine and cymbals along with music books and a book on making rhythm kits. Another new service is our e-magazines, which can be found on the Overdrive e-book website.

The library staff gave back to the community by participating in Pajamarama on April 17th and raised over \$100 for pediatric cancer. Staff members also celebrated Earth Day by picking up trash along East Genesee Street. In the fall, we put together shoeboxes for the homeless. The Baldwinsville Food Pantry was our Christmas charity and we currently have a box for donations to the pantry in our lobby.

We appreciate the opportunity to serve the Baldwinsville community and on behalf of the Board of Trustees, staff and volunteers we would like to thank you for your continued support of the library.
