For homes with \$100,000 assessment in Lysander, Van Buren and Clay, it is anticipated that the **total library tax bill** for 2009-2010 will be **\$62.00**. This is an anticipated increase of **\$2.43** over last year's bill.

Baldwinsville Public Library serves taxpayers within the Baldwinsville School District who are eligible to vote on the library budget April 23, 2009 if they are at least 18 years of age and have lived in the school district for at least 30 days prior to the election date.

The Baldwinsville Public Library was established in 1948 and today serves as a community center for life-long learning, an economic engine for job seekers and small business entrepreneurs and a meeting site for numerous community organizations and groups.


