

The library fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30 each year.

The proposed library budget for 2012-2013 is \$1,459,560. It is anticipated that the **total library tax bill** for 2012-2013 for homes with \$100,000 assessments in Lysander, Van Buren and Clay will be \$58.51. This is an anticipated tax decrease over last year's bill.

Taxpayers within the Baldwinsville School District are eligible to vote on the library budget April 26, 2012 if they are at least 18 years of age and have lived in the school district for at least 30 days prior to the election date.


The Public Computing Center was very busy in 2011. Here's just some of what we've been up to:

- We trained almost 600 people using the mobile training lab. Classes offered included Microsoft Word, QuickBooks, eBook training and Skype.
- To meet a growing demand for training, the staff began offering workshops on Friday afternoons in addition to Wired Wednesday classes traditionally offered by the library.
- Seventy-four people had one-on-one appointments with PCC staff for help with their resumes and for jobs online.
- Over 100 people had individual sessions with PCC staff for help with computer use.
- Approximately 170 patrons use the Public Computing Center Services each week. This includes workshops, individual sessions with staff and using computers to look for employment.
- A Small Business Resource Day featured agencies who assist small business owners in many ways.
- New telecommunications equipment was purchased in December. This gives the library the opportunity to connect with up to three other sites for training and other events. Stay tuned for more about this exciting new service!

From the Director:

Once again library usage increased in 2011, with visits to the library, items checked out, reference questions answered, program attendance, computer users, active patrons and collection size all on the rise. Despite claims that public libraries are becoming obsolete with the advent of eBooks and the Internet, just the opposite is true across the country as people are turning to their libraries for access to public computers, programming to help with computer skills and job seeking, meeting room space, leisure reading materials in a variety of formats and reliable information from purchased databases and trained professionals.

Baldwinsville was very fortunate to be among the 30 New York State libraries to receive the multi-year federal stimulus grant entitled **broadbandexpress@yourlibrary**, which is described inside this report along with a financial status report. The proposed budget includes the salary for a full-time person to continue some of the grant activities and partnerships will be sought in the community to fund others.

Weighing the increased demand for materials and services against the need for fiscal responsibility, the Board of Trustees has carefully formulated a budget that is asking the taxpayers for less than the 2% tax cap recommended by Governor Cuomo. The proposed tax for 2012-2013 is anticipated to result in a total tax of \$58.51 for homes with \$100,000 assessments in the Towns of Lysander, Van Buren and Clay. Last year's proposal, which was anticipated to be a total of \$60.33 in property taxes, was actually only \$58.91 due to continued growth in the Baldwinsville Central School District.

The Board has also actively sought other grants, such as a New York State Library Construction grant that provided part of the money for replacement of the damaged facade on the north side of the library; participated in a consortial energy purchasing contract through BOCES to save money on electricity; and held several fundraising events during the year, to mitigate the tax impact on local residents.

The Board and staff consider ourselves lucky to have wonderful community support in Baldwinsville for our library. We hope to see you in the library or making use of our online resources during the coming year to take advantage of all that we offer!
